**SAT 3<sup>rd</sup> JULY AMERSHAM CIRCULAR (**approx 7 miles). Some road walking from the station into newly planted Jubilee Wood, across fields to Little Chalfont, cross a golf course to lunch at The Ivy House, or bring picnic. See some of the HS2 works and follow the River Missenden back to Amersham Old Town, with plenty of tea shops and pubs. Train from Marylebone 10.27 a. 11.02 or tube from Baker Street 10.05 and 10.54. Return trains to Marylebone, 09 and 39 past hour, tubes 17 and 47. EX 172. Leader will meet you in Amersham, Yvonne D.

**SUN 4**th **JULY FOLKESTONE WEST TO DOVER (LINEAR)** 10 miles). Coastal along the North Downs Way clifftop path. Via Sugarloaf Hill, Creteway Down, Lydden Spout, Shakespeare Cliff. 1 climb near start. **TUES 27<sup>th</sup> JULY EVENING WALK-BELGRAVIA** (1.5 miles) Known as Five Fields during the Middle Ages, it became a dangerous place due to highwaymen and robberies. Developed in the early 19<sup>th</sup> century by Richard Grosvenor, 2<sup>nd</sup> Marquess of Westminster, under the direction of Thomas Cubitt. It is now one of the wealthiest districts in the world. Meet Sloane Square tube station 18.00. Walk ends in Knightsbridge. Leader: Dominique

SAT 31<sup>st</sup> LEWES CIRCULAR (14.5 miles) Wonderful but possibly challenging post-lockdown walk including bits of the South Downs Way. The paths are generally excellent but here are three mighty climbs which are well worth the effort for the rewards at top & bottom. The tea garden at Glynde is particularly lovely but we need to keep up a good pace to get there in time. Meet Victoria station. Buy OPDR to Lewes. Dep. 9.24. Arr Lewes 10.26. We reward ourselves after the first climb with a swift half at the Abergavenny Arms in Rodmell. Picnic lunch by the church at Southease. SAT 21<sup>st</sup> AUGUST THE JOHN RAY WALK-BRAINTREE to WITHAM (ESSEX) LINEAR (9 miles) This walk celebrates the life and achievements of John Ray — a naturalist and philosopher- heralded as the father of English natural history and who laid the foundations for the classification of all living things. Easy walking through gently undulating countryside which can be cut short at the mid-way point in White Notley. Meet Liverpool Street Station. Buy Super OPDR to Braintree. Dep. 9.47, (Stratford 9.54), arr. Braintree 10.50. Return £17.55 from Liverpool Street, £14.25 from Stratford with Senior Railcard. Lunch Cross Keys pub, White Notley or picnic. Return from Witham. **SUN 22 AUGUST**: **RESCHEDULED HITCHIN OUTER ORBITAL CIRCULAR (HOOP)** (13 miles) *Surprisingly rural walk through a nature reserve along a river and across the beautiful rolling Hertfordshire countryside along footpaths and lanes a short distance from the pretty market town of Hitchin*. **SAT 4<sup>th</sup> SEPTEMBER <u>FAMBRIDGE TO BURNHAM LINEAR</u> (11 miles) The Crouch Estuary is a haven for birdlife, with great views of unspoilt land either side of the estuary, disturbed only by the cry of seabirds and the occasional hum of a distant train. Mostly flat terrain. Meet Liverpool Street Dep. 9.33 (change Wickford) arr. 10.30. Buy Super OPDR to Burnham-on-Crouch (£19.50, with railcard £12.85). Lunch Three Horseshoes, Althorne or picnic. SAT 11<sup>th</sup> SEPTEMBER MAIDENHEAD to MARLOW LINEAR (8.8 miles) An easy morning walk through Maidenhead to follow the Thames Path from Brunel's Rail Bridge to Cookham where lunch will be taken and the walk can be ended (5.1m). A short but steep and narrow climb onto an escarpment with fine views of the Thames Valley before descending to Marlow for hourly train changing at Maidenhead. Meet Paddington Station. Freedom Pass holders buy single Marlow (or Cookham) to Maidenhead if returning by TFL rail. Non Freedom Pass holders OPDR to Marlow (or Cookham). Train Dep. **SAT 18<sup>th</sup> SEPTEMBER** <u>HENLEY ON THAMES CIRCULAR</u> (10 miles) Walk from Henley via The Great Wood. Lunch stop Hambledon at the Stag and Huntsman or picnic if preferred.
